Extra food is now utilized in a grab and Go for sale. Transportation is the second most popular option available. 34-36 thousand rides per year, perimeter is within FH and Farm. Medical appointments and dialysis are the most utilized. \$2.00 round trip donation, Phone numbers located inside the "Messenger" COPIES OF THE MESSENGER ARE AVAILABLE AT THE COSTICK CENTER. A monthly calendar inside the Messenger also. Outreach counselor available for individuals in need of special services. This is important for seniors without any family support. We also have volunteers who can do other services, computer help, etc. Outreach has a shop in the Costick Center where they can sell items that have been donated like greeting cards etc. The monies are used to help individuals who needs help with rent, etc. Adult day program, people with dementia. They are picked up and delivered, a reasonable rate is charged. Five days a week, 9-3. Max of 15 per session. Julie who runs program has a BS in Gerontology and Certificate in Dementia Care. \$42.00 per day for residents, \$48.00 for non-residents per day. Yoga, Chair exercise, pickle ball, aquatics, dancing, day trips, Special Events, Volunteer breakfasts, Veterans Day Lunch. Support Groups. Ladies group makes Bears for Cancer patients, each is personalized. Check Handouts for upcoming events. Many handouts available at the Costick Center. Outsanding Presentation.

Guest Speaker: Fritz Beiermeister, Farmington Kids First, Topic: Farmington Schools Bond Funds; Appointed as a member of a team that reviews the Bond utilization, all non school citizens, Of the 20

largest school districts in the state, all are experiencing the downsizing problem that Farmington is having now. Approximately 9,000 to 9500 students now down from approximately 14,000. Explained the reason for the Bond issue and how the monies are being spent.
